NEWSLETTER 35: JANUARY 2021

Greetings to all members and friends, and despite the continued grim settings of the pandemic may I wish you **all the best for 2021** and many more "Tight Lines" than we had last season. I hope this finds you all safe and well. As we begin to get ready for the season ahead it seems likely many of the restrictions we had to follow in 2020 will apply again in 2021. The first part of club life to fall to the pandemic was of course the main meeting of each year:-

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2021 CANCELLED

Club Secretary Okain McLennan is preparing the accounts for us and once scrutinised by the committee we will circulate them by email to all members. However meantime I have to formally notify you that we will <u>not</u> hold an AGM in 2021 but instead "roll over" the current committee and Office Bearers until February 2022. Charges and rules will remain unchanged wherever possible and this decision by the committee is in line with the constitution of the club. Happier days are ahead hopefully when more members will be able to participate in the running of the club as well as getting involved in club and inter-club competitions. In the good news zone - during the first travel restriction period of 2020, when we had stopped visitor ticket sales but members were able to fish, we recruited many new local members. Accordingly, membership income stayed strong. Meantime Okain has prepared this interim financial report:-

FINANCIAL REPORT 2020

It has been a tough year for the Club. Like many other angling clubs in Scotland (unlike in England) there has been no financial help available yet from the Scottish Government to compensate for the loss in revenue due to COVID-19. Despite this, during the few months we were able to fish, the Club did well to take in over \$5800 in ticket sales – juts over 50% of normal sales income. Club membership has remained stable and we are grateful to those members who continued to stay with the Club during these difficult times.

In addition, the Club managed to deliver on the pontoon moorings on Loch Meig and pay for all the associated costs. There is still some remedial work to be done to correct and balance out the weight of the bridge section which depresses and tilts the first pontoon, but we aim – lockdown permitting – to correct this before the start of the season. We are very grateful to the **SSE Community Windfarm Fund** for the grant enabling this project and the **Highland Council Leader Fund** grant, with the Club contributing £2000 the balance of the costs, along with many many hours of assistance.

The Club has an outstanding invoice for Fishery Board Rates bill of $\pounds 2062.50$ but when this is paid we will have a balance of $\pounds 12837$ to take forward for this season. This, quite frankly is much better than we could have hoped for given the recent events.

CATCH RETURNS 2020

Despite all the restrictions that COVID-19 placed on us all this year, when restrictions were eased for a time, a few determined members managed to get out and fish our waters. This undoubtedly stopped a few of us from going totally stir crazy! A total of 24 salmon were caught, 8 kept and 16 returned, with the majority of 15 coming off the River Blackwater- mainly in September. The biggest recorded fish of 8 lbs was caught on the Upper Conon in August and duly returned. Compared to an overall total of 29 salmon caught in 2019, this was a very good result given the shortened season

Trout numbers were equally buoyant with a total of 771 fish caught, 289 kept and 482 returned. Against a total of 943 fish caught in 2019, this was an exceptionally good result and a tribute to our stocking policy ably organised by John Cartlidge. The biggest trout recorded weighed in at $3\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. John has decided to take a break from being our stocking co-ordinator and we thank him for his careful and assiduous work in managing our stocking for many years.

We are grateful to all those members who submitted a return this year and it will be even more important that **all** members do so in 2021. The Scottish Government are demanding ever more details about fish catches from all Clubs and angling bodies. Failure to provide accurate returns can lead to substantial financial penalties for the Club – something we must avoid.



WINTER LEAGUE 2020-21

We badly missed our run of competitions last season as all the clubs abandoned any hope of running inter-club contests during the pandemic restrictions. Safe and sensible approaches were adopted as soon as allowed to let anglers get out and fish but the competitions were clearly a no go area.

However, by carefully following detailed Covid Safe restrictions we managed to start the Winter League early with our first outing as usual at Achagour Fishery in October. There followed three further legs, two at Glen of Rothes and then Lagg Fishery in December, but January's lockdown rules have so far prevented the competition continuing into 2021. At the moment we are hoping to have one final leg, our usual final meet at Lagg, late in March but only if it is safe to do so. It seems certain restrictions will apply for some further time.
